The U.S. Government and trained foresters ensure practices that promote new growth while protecting precious wilderness, biodiversity and ecosystems. As a matter of fact, six trees are planted for each one harvested annually. This fact, coupled with natural forest regeneration, means growth exceeds harvest by 47% in the U.S.

So our great-great grandchildren should have plenty of trees to climb and woods to explore. And we wouldn't stand to have it any other way.
